Either and Neither, Both and None, So do I and Neither do I

These are called **Determiners** in English. We use **both, neither, either** when talking about two things.

Either... or is used to offer a choice between two possibilities:

Either Carmen **or** Danielle will be there.

You can **either** do your homework **or** read a book.

Neither... nor is equivalent to not either... or.

Mohammed speaks **neither** English **nor** French.

My mother drinks **neither** coffee **nor** tea.

Neither can also be followed by (one) of + group of two:

Neither of us has any money.

Neither is used like not... either.

I don't speak Arabic.

Neither do I.

Me **neither**.(informal)

He isn't ready to go to the party.

Neither are we.

Agreeing and Disagreeing - So do I, Neither do I

To agree with a positive statement:

'I like tea without sugar.'

'So do I.'

To agree with a negative statement:

'I don't like tea with sugar.'

'Nor do I.' or **'Neither do I.'**
