Like & As

When we talk about comparison between people, things or actions, we can use **like** or **as**, depending on the structure.

Like is a preposition which should be followed by a noun or a pronoun.

Examples:

Mary is just **like** her mother.

Do not talk **like** that to your parents!

As is a conjunction which should be followed by a clause (subject + verb).

Examples:

Peter is a math teacher, **as** his mother was.

As with many geniuses, Mozart was inclined to eccentric behaviour.

As can also be used to refer to a person's profession.

Examples:

Martin has trained **as** an architect.

Fiona has worked **as** a cook in an elegant restaurant.
